Varanasi Development Authority Hosts Key Review Meeting with Real Estate Stakeholders

Under the leadership of Vice Chairman Shri Pulkit Garg, the Varanasi Development Authority (VDA) conducted a pivotal meeting with the Builders and Developers Association and the Purvanchal Real Estate Association. The focus was on the amended Building Construction and Development By-laws 2008 and Rain Water Harvesting strategies.

VDA's Town Planner, Shri Prabhat Kumar, detailed the amendments made to the Building Bylaws, emphasizing the need for thorough scrutiny of forms and records before submission for approval. He highlighted the importance of adhering to approved construction maps to avoid mitigation.

The meeting addressed challenges in obtaining NOCs from the Municipal Corporation, with directives issued to expedite resolutions. Notable attendees included Chief Development Officer Shri Himanshu Nagpal and representatives from CREDAI, ARC Group, and Didwania Group.





Varanasi Development Authority Conducts Inspection of World Bank-Aided Projects in Sarnath

Shri Kaushal Raj Sharma (Divisional Commissioner), Chairman Varanasi Development Authority, together with Vice Chairman Shri Pulkit Garg, recently inspected the ongoing World Bank-assisted Pro-Poor Project sites in Sarnath. These sites include critical infrastructure developments such as roads, vending zones, and public amenities stretching from Sarang Nakbandi to the Railway Station, and from Dharmapala Square to Ganpati Tiraha.

During the inspection, the Divisional Commissioner expressed concerns regarding the slow progress and substandard quality of work. He issued specific directives to accelerate the construction of key features like the mural and interpretation wall at Sarangnath temple and

Ganpati Tiraha. Additionally, he ordered improvements to the footpath, drainage systems, and the development of green areas and city forests. The Divisional Commissioner mandated that KK Construction adhere strictly to the design plans and complete the work within two months or face penalties under the terms of their contract.

The inspection was attended by notable officials including Municipal Commissioner Shri Akshat Verma, Joint Magistrate Sadar, Secretary Dr. Ved Prakash Mishra, Additional Municipal Commissioner, Executive Engineer Anand Mishra, Assistant Engineer Shivaji Mishra, Junior Engineer Vijay Singh, Urban Planner Aman Shahu, and representatives from KK Construction.





The enforcement team of the Varanasi Development Authority, Varanasi Zone-5, has taken decisive action against P.W. Gurukulam School for non-compliance with approved



construction plans. The school complex, which includes a hostel and staff residences located on Arazi numbers 5, 6, 7 parts, and 8 in Mauja Gauri, Pargana-Dhus Ward-Mughalsarai, was initially granted approval by the Vice Chairman Shri Pankaj Rai, on January 16, 2017. Despite fulfilling the financial obligations by depositing Rs. 1,27,96,890.00 into the Authority fund on August 29, 2018, the school administration failed to comply with the specified map restrictions and conditions. This oversight resulted in the non-

A recent inspection by the Zone Team revealed significant deviations from the approved mitigation and proposed map, with the school currently operational within the non-compliant structures. Consequently, a notice has been issued under the relevant sections of the UP Town Planning and Development Act, 1973. The involved parties have been directed to rectify the

issuance of the final building map.


Construction in Varanasi Zone-4

Notices, including a show cause and a stop work order, were initially issued on October 21, 2019, under Sections 27, 28(1), and 28(ii) of the UP Town Planning and Development Act, 1973. Despite these notices, construction activities continued unabated. Consequently, the structure was sealed on April 8, 2024, and the site was placed under the custody of the Pandeypur Police Station.

Zonal Officer Singh Gaurav Jai Prakash, Junior Engineer Atul Mishra were present.
