Sealing Action: Crackdown on Illegal **Construction in Varanasi**

The enforcement team of Varanasi Development Authority, Zone-1, executed sealing proceedings against illegal construction as per the Vice Chairperson's directives. On May 3rd, 2024, notices were issued under sections 27, 28 (i), and 28 (ii) of the UP Town Planning and Development Act, 1973, against unauthorized construction by Vishnu Priya at building S.18/33 Mint House Nadesar Ward-Sikroul, Varanasi. The building was sealed on the same day and handed over to Cantt Police Station for monitoring.

The operation was overseen by Zonal Officer Singh Gaurav Jai Prakash and Assistant Engineer Devesh Ram Gupta, reinforcing the VDA's commitment to lawful urban development.



Timely Approval: VDA Achieves Swift Approval for Group Housing Project

In a remarkable achievement, the Varanasi Development Authority, led by Vice Chairman Pulkit Garg, approved a group housing project of 392 flats within 98 hours. The project, situated on a 12,129 square meter plot in revenue village Dandupur, features a 45-meter-high building. This swift approval is set to generate approximately Rs 4.84 crores in revenue for the authority.

This accomplishment highlights VDA's efficiency and commitment to promoting urban development in the region.







Enforcement Action: By VDA in Ramnagar against Illegal Construction

Following the Vice Chairman's instructions, the Varanasi Development Authority's enforcement team in Zone-5 took action against illegal construction in Ward-Ramnagar. Notices were issued on August 10, 2023, under sections 27, 28 (i), and 28 (ii) of the Uttar Pradesh Town Planning and Development Act, 1973. The unauthorized construction, carried out by Dream Solution Furniture House Private Limited, was sealed on May 2, 2024, and handed over to the custody of Ramnagar police station.

The operation was overseen by Zonal Officer Mr. Prakash and Junior Engineer P.N. Dubey, demonstrating the VDA's commitment to maintaining lawful urban development.


